GROUND REGULATIONS

All persons entering the Stadium on match days are only admitted subject to these rules and regulations:

- 1) The Club reserves the right to eject from the ground and prosecute, if thought appropriate, any person within the clubs premises who is considered in breach of the following: **a)** Entering the ground by any means other than through the proper turnstiles or gates. **b)** Entering the field of play before, during or after the game. **c)** Using obscene or abusive language or persistent swearing likely to cause offence. **d)** Using terms of abuse, racial or otherwise, that is likely to offend. **e)** Being drunk or being under the influence of drugs. **f)** Making vulgar or obscene gestures. **g)** Carrying any offensive object or throwing any article onto the field of play.
- 2) The Club reserves the right to refuse admission or eject from the ground any person who refuses to be searched by any servant or agent of the club or any Police Officer.
- 3) No glass bottles, drinking glasses or other such article or object is permitted in the ground and the Club Officials / Stewards will have the right to seize or confiscate any item or article considered to be a danger to others.
- 4) Climbing of the fences, stands and other structures including sitting on the barriers around the pitch is not permitted.
- 5) All vehicles are parked at the owner's risk.
- 6) Only players, officials and club personnel may enter the changing room area.

FRAMLINGHAM TOWN

Founded in 1887, the Clubs first ground was Dickson's Meadow, followed by Brunning's Meadow, both being part of the Framlingham College complex. The Club next moved to The Red House Farm before setting up at Hayning's Meadow, now known as "The Pageant Field" in 1932. In 1951 the Club became a member section of the newly-formed Framlingham Sports Club and has had its ground here ever since.

In its 134 years of football, Framlingham has played in various Leagues. The Ipswich & District League, then the Framlingham League in its early years. Next up was the Woodbridge League with progress into the Leiston League at the end of WW2 until 1966. At this time the Club gained admission into the Ipswich & District Premier (now SIL Senior) League and competed in for many decades.

During this time there have been many ups & downs in the form of promotion and relegation and even a dip into Division 2 but Senior status was regained in 1989.

There then followed some very successful years as Framlingham won "The McNeil Cup" in 1990 and were SIL Senior runners-up in 1991. This was followed in 1992 by the SIL Senior League title & McNeil Cup double and in 1996 we reached the SCFA Senior Cup Final and were again, League runners-up in 1997.

Since that successful period of time the Clubs fortunes have been varied with relegations and promotions but we eventually gained Senior status once more and after a workman like season gained promotion to the Thurlow Nunn Division 1 League in 2016/17 and step 6 of the National League pyramid.

The inaugural season was very successful, finishing in the top half and was followed by an even better 2017/18 season by finishing runners-up and gaining promotion to the Premier Division and step 5 of the National League pyramid, whilst also competing in the FA Cup for the very first time and having a good run in the FA Vase.

The clubs highest ever achievement! The 2018/19 season in the TN Premier League was a tough one for the Club and although there were many good battling performances we eventually succumbed to relegation.

The 2019/20 season beckoned back in the Thurlow Nunn Div1 North League and with a mid table position secured the infamous Covid-19 pandemic struck and basically cancelled all football!

Hopes were high that the 2020/21 season would go ahead, however, apart from success in reaching the Suffolk Senior Cup Semi's and our Reserves reaching the Suffolk Reserve Cup Semi's, Covid-19 continued to disrupt the season which ended yet again. We hope that the 2021/22 season can move forward for the whole season uninterrupted?

The success of any Club is built on the hard endeavours of its Committee, volunteers & supporters and the standard of the facilities & grounds at Framlingham are a tribute to those people and their endeavours both past & present who have built a strong and stable Club over those many

years.

Some of our older committee stalwarts known and respected by many around the Suffolk footballing fraternity, namely Mr Bryan Parker & Mr & Mrs Sydney Vice have now retired from their club duties.

Sydney accepted his Long Service Meritorious Award back in 1991, our long serving secretary Fiona Whatling accepted hers in 1998 with Bryan Parker having received his in 2016. Keith Whatling was the last to receive his 50 years of service award as recent as 2020. A great achievement by any standard!

2019 saw Bryan Parker step down as Club President after some 27 years in the position and we welcomed in Mr Iain Smith as our new President as we move forward into the future!

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The inaugural season was very successful, finishing in the top half and was followed by an even better 2017/18 season by finishing runners-up and gaining promotion to the Premier Division whilst also competing in the FA Cup for the very first time and having a good run in the FA Vase.

The 2018/19 season in the TN Premier League proved to be very tough for the club and although there were many good battling performances, we succumbed to relegation with the Thurlow Nun Div 1 North League beckoning for the 2019/20 season start. With a midtable position secured, the infamous Covid-19 pandemic struck, wiping out the rest of the 2019/20 season! Hopes were high that the 2020/21 season would go ahead, however, apart from success in reaching the SFA Senior Cup Semi's and our Reserves reaching the SFA Reserve Cup Semi's, Covid-19 continued to disrupt the season and ultimately ended it once again. With Covid-19 in decline, the

2021/22 season got underway and for 'The Castlemen' was a very successful year culminating in a 5th place League finish and a Semi-final play-off match at Harleston Town, losing 2-1 at the final whistle after a tight game.

FTFC is built on solid foundations formed from the hard endeavours of its committee, volunteers, sponsors & supporters, and the standard of our facilities & grounds are testament to those people and their continued hard work both past & present, establishing a strong & stable club over many years and beyond.

We are honoured to have many local legends within the club who are known and respected throughout the Suffolk footballing fraternity. Namely, Bryan Parker, Sydney & Christine Vice, Fiona & Keith (Curly) Whatling amongst others, all of which have received 50yr Service Awards over recent years. 2019 saw Bryan step down as President after some 27 years in the role and was replaced by Iain Smith who in 2023 decided to step down after 5 years in the role.

Sydney accepted his Long Service Meritorious Award way back in 1991 and after decades of dedication to FTFC, has now stepped down from all duties after his wife, Christine, sadly passed away in 2021.

2022/23 saw the 'Castlemen' enjoy one of their most successful seasons in recent years including numerous Semi-Finals, Cup/Trophy Finals & play-off Semi-Finals. Our A Team won the SIL Div 4 League and promotion to Div3, while our Reserves narrowly missed out in the TN Chell Trophy Final and our Veterans ending the season as League Runners-Up.

However, the season culminated

at Colchester United with the First team beating AFC Sudbury Reserves to win the Suffolk Senior Cup Final for the very first time in the club's 135yr history.

The Club also undertook & completed some major facility improvements including our new pitch perimeter and security fencing project.

With the 2023 season, came some restructuring within the management committee with Dean Warner, Chairman for the previous 9yrs being appointed Club President while Tom Palmer, our main sponsor, taking up the role of Chairman along with other new appointments.

The club continued their progressive facility improvement program including, improved food outlet facilities, major upgrades to Syd's Place facilities and numerous other projects were completed.

On the field, the club experienced a mixed season with the first team falling foul of the Play - Off Semis once again.

The Club has continued its journey into the 2024/25 season with the completion of our new LED Floodlight upgrade project. A major project undertaken & supported by numerous Club management, volunteers & organisations who we are forever grateful to for their support.

We also appointed new joint Chairmen. Chris Howard & Karl Legg, both local to Framlingham, are now leading the way as we continue to improve & move the club forward.

AFC PEGASUS HISTORY



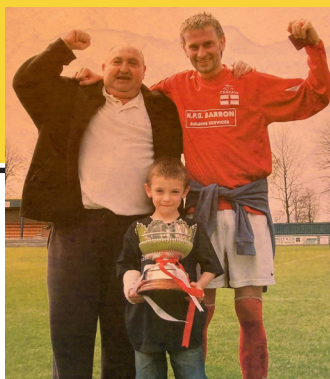
AFC Pegasus Colchester Football Club was derived from the most successful Sunday League side in Colchester history, AFC Pegasus, who won an incredible 64 honours over a period of 30 years with Paul and Heather Booth at the helm for every one of them.

AFC Pegasus in turn was created from Pegasus Youth in 1985 who had a great history in the Colchester Youth League for many years dating back to the early 1970's with the founder being Mr Peter Peters.

When Paul and Heather stepped aside a new era under son, Ian Booth (pictured above in red with Paul) was about to begin and the transition from Sunday League to Saturday football for the senior team in 2018 opened the door for the return of the youth set up at the club.

With a moved to Stanway School the club name was changed to Stanway Pegasus.

With passion and drive to succeed than ever before, both off and off the pitch, we were ready to start that new era. With various youth and men's teams in full swing, our vision is to be one of the biggest clubs in Essex that has men's teams competing at a high level of non-league football who lead



the way for the youth set-up.

This youth set-up will progress through their age groups starting at U6's, all the way through to U18's.

This is what we call 'The Pathway'. Although player development is a key aspect of our philosophy, the aim for the youth is to enjoy playing football for Pegasus and looking at the talented home grown youth squads we have, boys and girls the future is looking very good under the guidance of our Head of Youth Ray Turner.

The Club prides itself hugely on former and current players plus youth managers taking up major roles within the Club whilst surrounding ourselves with people we trust.

Soon to be added to the Pegasus family were the women, girls and recently the Vets as the club proudly sits at over 30 teams have been the fastest growing Club in the area and success is no stranger with many league titles and promotions along with cup success the Club is blossoming into a huge success story and long may it continue.



Senior football for the men's

first team was secured for the first time at the end of the 2021 /22 season with the team gaining promotion from Essex and Suffolk Border Premier League where they

went unbeaten winning the league with 98 points from 34 games scoring 126 goals in the process.

They also beat Tiptree Heath 1-0 in the League Cup Final at Little Oakley. Max Booth was the Division's top goal scorer with 34 (26 league and 8 Cup)

2022/23 Season saw the team in the Eastern Counties Division One South where we narrowly lost out on promotion at the first attempt via a penalty



shoot out after a 2-2 draw against Sporting Bengal.



Although heartbreaking at the time looking back and what a debut season for the club in senior football. Callum Griffith was the Division's top goal scorer with 32 (29 league and 3 Cup / Play offs)

Rosi Webb (Pictured below left) was a revelation for our club during this period being the Men's 1st team manager while also playing in the successful ladies' teams she was indeed Mrs Pego and quite rightly got the accolades she deserved.

From the 2023/24 Season the Men's first team moved sideways from the Eastern Counties Division One South division to the North division while the Men's Reserve team are competing in the Essex and Suffolk Border League's Premier Division.

The ladies have been just as successful in a short period of time with winning the Essex County Woman's Premier League piping by 2 points local rivals Stanway Rovers to seal back to back promotions that now see them competing in the Eastern Region League for the first time as the club looks to push on in all fronts.

A Ladies reserve team was

started up and joined the Essex County Woman's League Division 3.

The club also entered the FA Vase for the first time playing six matches beating Haverhill Borough, Takeley, Halstead Town, Barkingside and London Lions before falling to eventual finalists Romford in the 4th Round proper.

The first team season ended in Play Off defeat for a second season running, this time 3-0 at Holland FC in the Semi Finals.

2024-25 season was the best league season so far, finishing runners up in Eastern Counties Division One North and only missing to in the play off final to Harwich & Parkeston on pens.

In November 2025 after 6 years in charge Rosi Webb moved on to a role in the Charlton Athletic Ladies set up and Jon Moody took on the first team manager role.

After the mixed first half to the season the team picked up and claimed a play off place. After beating Holland FC away in the semi final we lost 3-0 at FC Peterborough in the Final.

For the 2026-27 season a new era began as the club reverted to the name AFC Pegasus Colchester and also started the new side in the Under 18s Thurlow Nunn League.

NON-LEAGUE talents Abdul Abdulmalik and Danny Ormerod have been making headlines all summer.

They were making them last season as well in fairness, with their performances on the pitch.

Abdulmalik (pictured) starred for Boreham Wood in their run to the National League promotion final, his dazzling quick-feet lighting up Wembley back in May.

Ormerod fired 31 goals as AFC Fylde, where he came through the academy, won the National League North title to return to Step 1.

Unsurprisingly, the scouts had noticed and clubs higher up the food chain wanted in.

Both clubs were public in saying they didn't want to sell their starlets.

And that's been the position until last week where both were eventually sold within a matter of days of each other.

Abdulmalik to Swedish side Djurgardens IF for a reported £1.5million fee – a new record – and Ormerod to well-known diamond polishers Peterborough United for £600,000.

It shows the level of Non-League football and the talent of both players they are able to command such fees – with both clubs potentially bagging future revenue like sell-ons down the line.

The pursuit of Abdulmalik has turned into a bit of a saga with an unfortunate end where he was no longer training or playing for Wood – he did score against FC Halifax – and the club frustrated by “press leaks” around his situation.

But upon departure the 23-year-old, who won The NLP's Young Player of the Year at our National Game Awards last season, said: “The club means a lot to me because of how I've been supported here by fans, players and staff.

“Something I didn't expect was to make as many great connections with staff and teammates who are either still at the club or have left, it really is a great place.

“The support I was shown allowed me to express myself so freely on the pitch and produce memorable moments, and I can't thank them enough.

“My relationship with the supporters was good, I'd say. We'd interact in the 'Glass House' sometimes and have positive conversations.

“I enjoyed playing in front of you all and I wish the club all the best. I can't wait to see the club in the EFL and progress as far as they can.”

Ormerod scored in two of his three games for Fylde this season and made his Posh debut last Saturday in their League One defeat at Blackpool.

“We had a chat with him in the office a couple of days after getting promoted,” Fylde boss Craig Mahon told The NLP. “Obviously there was all talk about him then. I know he was injured but he was coming back and loads of people were talking about him, what he could do and where he could go.

“My big thing to him was, ‘Just don't lose your hunger to be the best player on the pitch’. That's what Danny has. If you watch his games, he never stops running, he never stops giving everything.

“I said to him, ‘You've got all the talent, just keep your hunger and you will go onto bigger and better things’.

“He's done that all through pre-season, he's started the season so well again. It's a shame for us to lose such a character and a great player in the dressing room. That's football. We have nothing but good things to say about Danny.”

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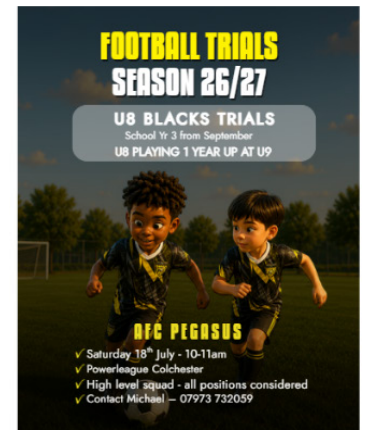
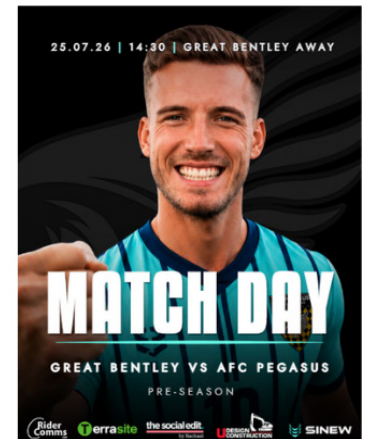
