GROUND REGULATIONS

All persons entering the Stadium on match days are only admitted subject to these rules and regulations:

- 1) The Club reserves the right to eject from the ground and prosecute, if thought appropriate, any person within the clubs premises who is considered in breach of the following: **a)** Entering the ground by any means other than through the proper turnstiles or gates. **b)** Entering the field of play before, during or after the game. **c)** Using obscene or abusive language or persistent swearing likely to cause offence. **d)** Using terms of abuse, racial or otherwise, that is likely to offend. **e)** Being drunk or being under the influence of drugs. **f)** Making vulgar or obscene gestures. **g)** Carrying any offensive object or throwing any article onto the field of play.
- 2) The Club reserves the right to refuse admission or eject from the ground any person who refuses to be searched by any servant or agent of the club or any Police Officer.
- 3) No glass bottles, drinking glasses or other such article or object is permitted in the ground and the Club Officials / Stewards will have the right to seize or confiscate any item or article considered to be a danger to others.
- 4) Climbing of the fences, stands and other structures including sitting on the barriers around the pitch is not permitted.
- 5) All vehicles are parked at the owner's risk.
- 6) Only players, officials and club personnel may enter the changing room area.

With home games again on the Wednesday & Saturday we have done a double header programme.

Rayleigh were losing Play Off Finalists in the South Division last season so on paper the two clubs couldn't be any more even.

Second up Wroxham Reserves, last season Wroxham finished in 5th place 2 point ahead of ourselves. The first meeting between the sides was here at Coggeshall in September and ended in a 2-2 draw. Wroxham won the return 2-0 in November.

On Saturday we had a disappointing 1-1 draw away at Needham Market. The game kicked off a couple of minutes early and by 14.59 we found ourselves 1-0 down. This gave Needham confidence and to be fair they play really well and bossed the first half.

Second half we had the better and Max Sherlock got us level but we were unable to find a winner. Many many more ups and downs to come

THURLOW NUNN FIRST DIVISION SOUTH PLAYOFF FINALISTS



Rayleigh Town Football Club were founded in 1897 initially under the name Rayleigh Star. In 1946 we reverted to Rayleigh Town FC.

In 1976 after time spent in the Southend & District League, we joined the Essex Olympian League and in 1979/80 won the league title for the first time repeating that feat with a second title in 1980/81.

We won further back- to - back titles in 1983/84 and 1984/85.

With further titles in 1989/90 & 2000/01 we continued to be a force and it was hoped within the club that financial backing would see us climb the football pyramid however this did not materialise and so we remained in the Essex Olympian League until 2023/24 when we won the title again and with a groundshare agreement in place at former conference side Concord Rangers we gained promotion to the Thurlow Nunn Eastern Counties League.

We also won the prestigious Essex Premier Cup the same season for the fourth time in our history under the guidance of the current management team.

In our first season at Step 6 of the football pyramid, we finished a creditable 4th having led the

table for much of the opening months. That 4th place finish saw the club qualify for the league playoffs and having beaten AS London 4- 1 in the semi final we narrowly missed out on promotion following a 2 - 0 defeat to Hackney Wick in the final.

The 2024/25 season also saw us competing in the FA Vase for the first time in our history and having navigated past the first two preliminary qualifying rounds we made our way through to the 2nd round proper losing late on 2- 4 at home to step 5 Harpenden Town.

A similar great run in the Essex Senior Cup saw us draw step 3 National League South side Hornchurch at home where we put in another creditable performance before losing out 0- 2.

2025/26 was another memorable season as we reached the play off finals for the second consecutive season. Having defeated Coggeshall Town away in the semi final 2 - 3 we found ourselves facing Clapton Community away in the final.

The game was played in front of a record crowd of 2,375 but it was heartbreak again for the Town as we lost out on promotion at the final hurdle following a 4- 2 defeat after extra time. The club has ambitious plans to progress further in the Football Pyramid and are hopeful of developments on that front that will see us return to our spiritual home in Rayleigh.

The 2026/27 season sees us switch venues as we will be playing our home games at the Len Salmon Stadium the home of Isthmian League side Bowers and Pitsea. The facilities are first class, and we hope it will assist us in our bid for promotion.

During the current season we will be celebrating our 130th anniversary and to mark this magnificent milestone we pay tribute to our original home colours of white shirts, navy shorts and navy socks. A commemorative gold badge has also been produced.

Wroxham Football Club is a football club based in Wroxham, Norfolk, England. They are currently members of the Isthmian League North Division and play at Trafford Park.

History

The club was established in 1892 by George Preston, a former captain of the Norfolk County team.

They played friendly matches until entering teams into the East Norfolk League and the Norwich City Junior League. They joined the East Anglian League in 1935, but after finishing bottom of the league in 1953–54 and 1954–55, they dropped into the Norwich and District League, a time during which they suffered a record 24–0 defeat.

When the East Anglian League merged with the Norfolk & Suffolk League to form the Anglian Combination in 1964, Wroxham joined the new league, becoming a member of Section D.

After winning the Norfolk Junior Cup in 1974–75, they were Division Two champions in 1975–76 and Division One champions the following season, earning promotion to the Premier Division.

In 1980–81 the club won the Knock-Out Cup, and in 1981–82 they were Premier Division champions, going on to retain the title in for the next three seasons, also winning the Knock-Out Cup in 1982–83, 1984–85 and 1986–87.

After winning the Premier Division of the Anglian Combination for a fifth time in 1987–88, Wroxham moved up to the newly formed Division One of the Eastern Counties League.

They won the division in its inaugural season, beating Halstead Town to the title on goal difference, and were promoted to the Premier Division.

After finishing twelfth in their first season in the Premier Division, the club finished eighth or higher in each of the next 22 seasons, winning the division for the first time with a record 99 points in 1991–92.

The 1992–93 was the club's centenary, and saw them

beat their record by retaining the league title with 100 points, as well as winning the League Cup and the Norfolk Senior Cup.

In 1993–94 they won a third consecutive Premier Division title.

After a gap of two seasons, the club won the Premier Division again in 1996–97 with 109 points, a season in which they also won the Senior Cup.

They retained the title and the Senior Cup in 1997–98, before winning the league for a third time in a row in 1998–99.

Further success saw Wroxham win the League Cup and Norfolk Senior Cup in 1999–2000, the Norfolk Senior Cup in 2001–02, 2003–04 and 2007–08, and the Eastern Counties League Premier Division title in 2006–07.

In 2009–10 the club reached the final of the FA Vase, but lost 6–1 to holders Whitley Bay.

In 2011–12 they won the Premier Division for the eighth time this time taking promotion to the North Division of the Isthmian League.

Although the club finished in the relegation zone in 2013–14, they were reprieved from relegation when Worksop Town resigned from the Northern Premier League.

The club finished in the relegation zone again in 2015–16, but were again reprieved.

However, they finished second-from-bottom of the division the following season and were relegated back to the Eastern Counties League Premier Division.

In 2021–22 the club were Premier Division runners-up, earning promotion back to the renamed North Division of the Isthmian League.

Ground

Wroxham (blue and white) ahead of an FA Cup tie against Saffron Walden. The club initially played at Wroxham Park.

They subsequently played at The Avenue and Keys Hill. In the 1940s the club moved to Trafford Park, a field on Skinners Lane.

An old timber pavilion was moved from the previous ground and used as a clubhouse. This was replaced by pre-fabricated buildings around fifteen years later.

The current main stand, the Les King Stand, was built in 1990, replacing a stand that had been in use for around a decade. Floodlights were erected in the early 1990s and a new clubhouse built in 1994.

The record attendance of 1,262 was set in 2010 for an FA Vase semi-final against Whitehawk.

AFC PEGASUS HISTORY



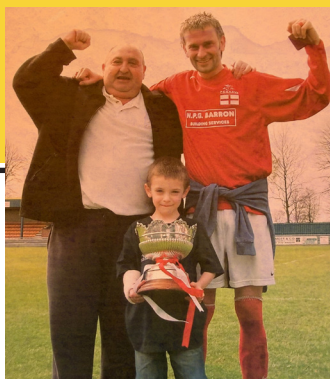
AFC Pegasus Colchester Football Club was derived from the most successful Sunday League side in Colchester history, AFC Pegasus, who won an incredible 64 honours over a period of 30 years with Paul and Heather Booth at the helm for every one of them.

AFC Pegasus in turn was created from Pegasus Youth in 1985 who had a great history in the Colchester Youth League for many years dating back to the early 1970's with the founder being Mr Peter Peters.

When Paul and Heather stepped aside a new era under son, Ian Booth (pictured above in red with Paul) was about to begin and the transition from Sunday League to Saturday football for the senior team in 2018 opened the door for the return of the youth set up at the club.

With a moved to Stanway School the club name was changed to Stanway Pegasus.

With passion and drive to succeed than ever before, both off and off the pitch, we were ready to start that new era. With various youth and men's teams in full swing, our vision is to be one of the biggest clubs in Essex that has men's teams competing at a high level of non-league football who lead



the way for the youth set-up.

This youth set-up will progress through their age groups starting at U6's, all the way through to U18's.

This is what we call 'The Pathway'. Although player development is a key aspect of our philosophy, the aim for the youth is to enjoy playing football for Pegasus and looking at the talented home grown youth squads we have, boys and girls the future is looking very good under the guidance of our Head of Youth Ray Turner.

The Club prides itself hugely on former and current players plus youth managers taking up major roles within the Club whilst surrounding ourselves with people we trust.

Soon to be added to the Pegasus family were the women, girls and recently the Vets as the club proudly sits at over 30 teams have been the fastest growing Club in the area and success is no stranger with many league titles and promotions along with cup success the Club is blossoming into a huge success story and long may it continue.



Senior football for the men's

first team was secured for the first time at the end of the 2021 /22 season with the team gaining promotion from Essex and Suffolk Border Premier League where they

went unbeaten winning the league with 98 points from 34 games scoring 126 goals in the process.

They also beat Tiptree Heath 1-0 in the League Cup Final at Little Oakley. Max Booth was the Division's top goal scorer with 34 (26 league and 8 Cup)

2022/23 Season saw the team in the Eastern Counties Division One South where we narrowly lost out on promotion at the first attempt via a penalty



shoot out after a 2-2 draw against Sporting Bengal.



Although heartbreaking at the time looking back and what a debut season for the club in senior football. Callum Griffith was the Division's top goal scorer with 32 (29 league and 3 Cup / Play offs)

Rosi Webb (Pictured below left) was a revelation for our club during this period being the Men's 1st team manager while also playing in the successful ladies' teams she was indeed Mrs Pego and quite rightly got the accolades she deserved.

From the 2023/24 Season the Men's first team moved sideways from the Eastern Counties Division One South division to the North division while the Men's Reserve team are competing in the Essex and Suffolk Border League's Premier Division.

The ladies have been just as successful in a short period of time with winning the Essex County Woman's Premier League piping by 2 points local rivals Stanway Rovers to seal back to back promotions that now see them competing in the Eastern Region League for the first time as the club looks to push on in all fronts.

A Ladies reserve team was

started up and joined the Essex County Woman's League Division 3.

The club also entered the FA Vase for the first time playing six matches beating Haverhill Borough, Takeley, Halstead Town, Barkingside and London Lions before falling to eventual finalists Romford in the 4th Round proper.

The first team season ended in Play Off defeat for a second season running, this time 3-0 at Holland FC in the Semi Finals.

2024-25 season was the best league season so far, finishing runners up in Eastern Counties Division One North and only missing to in the play off final to Harwich & Parkeston on pens.

In November 2025 after 6 years in charge Rosi Webb moved on to a role in the Charlton Athletic Ladies set up and Jon Moody took on the first team manager role.

After the mixed first half to the season the team picked up and claimed a play off place. After beating Holland FC away in the semi final we lost 3-0 at FC Peterborough in the Final.

For the 2026-27 season a new era began as the club reverted to the name AFC Pegasus Colchester and also started the new side in the Under 18s Thurlow Nunn League.

LAST week, we received confirmation that new pitch perimeter barrier rules have been introduced by the Football Association for Non-League clubs following its review into ground safety across the National League System.

It means that solid brick, breeze block and concrete barriers around pitches will finally now be a thing of the past at grounds across the country at Steps 1-6.

The FA review was called following the tragic passing of striker Billy Vigar, who died after suffering a significant brain injury following a collision with a perimeter wall while playing for Chichester City against Wingate & Finchley on September 25, 2025. He was just 21 years old.

After Vigar's death, a petition calling for a ban on brick walls around football pitches across the NLS received more than 4,000 signatures.

It came after Bath City's Alex Fletcher suffered a fractured skull after colliding with a concrete advertising hoarding during a match in November 2022.

Six months later, then Sports Minister Stuart Andrew joined forces with the Professional Footballers' Association (PFA) in writing to the FA, Premier League, English Football League and National League, calling on them to adopt a more proactive approach to player safety in this area.

Now, almost four years on, it has taken the most tragic of deaths to spark any kind of action. And even then it took 11 months to deliberate and pass! I mean, what on earth was there to discuss?

I've been openly critical of the Football Association and the relevant authorities for letting this fester for so long,

Still, we got there in the end and at least now Billy Vigar's legacy can go to helping protect and preserve player safety in years to come.

Around 160 football clubs affected by the changes have been informed of the updated regulations and will be required to take appropriate action "within a reasonable timeframe".

They have been told that all existing barriers that don't meet the criteria must be removed, or at the very least covered or protected.

Financial support will be available to clubs with the FA and the Premier League providing funding through the Premier League Stadium Fund.

In a statement last week, the FA said: "We have undertaken a review of pitch perimeter walls across the National League System and Women's National League to identify what improvements can be made to our Stadium Accreditation Criteria that will help clubs mitigate potential safety risks at their grounds and stadiums.

"As a result of this ongoing phased review, which has been conducted by independent Health and Safety experts, we have updated our Stadium Accreditation Criteria for the 2026/27 season.

"This includes introducing revised criteria relating to pitch perimeter barriers, which no longer permits solid brick, breeze block or concrete barriers around pitches across the National League System for men [Steps 1-6], and the Women's National League [Tiers 3-4].

"Any existing solid brick, breeze block or concrete barriers must be removed as soon as reasonably practicable or covered with suitable protection if they cannot be removed for structural reasons.

"We have informed the clubs at this level that will be required to take action as a result of these changes."

Following last Friday's announcement, a PFA spokesperson said: "Following the tragic death of Billy Vigar last year, we again highlighted these concerns and made clear our view that the lack of progress and leadership on this issue had been unacceptable.

"As part of working groups set up by the FA following Billy's death, we pushed for the FA's Stadium Accreditation criteria to be amended to ban these types of walls so that there is a clear and centralised policy for clubs to follow.

"Given that, it's a welcome step that the FA's regulations have now been changed to reflect that position.

"However, it will now be important for progress on the removal of such walls - and effective mitigation of risks ahead of their removal - to be properly monitored, and for clubs to be given the support they need so that these changes can happen as soon as possible. Player safety must always come first."

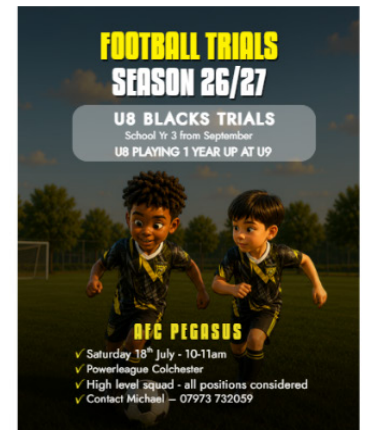
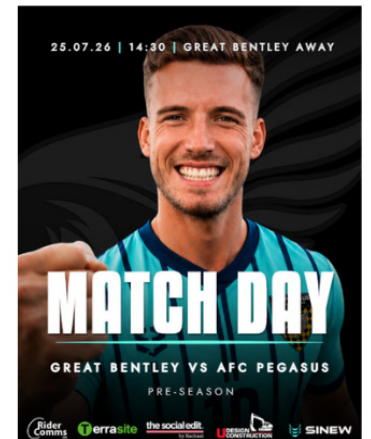
